#### **End of Year Summary**

#### Introduction

The 2024 season was a year of great improvement for Lake Cherokee. Our primary goals for this year were to improve the overall health of the lake by balancing aquatic vegetation coverage, improving fish size and health, transition to safer and more effective aquatic herbicides, and provide education and build community with shareholders around the lake. The data we collected at the end of the year survey showed excellent progress in these areas.

#### **Herbicides and Vegetation Management**

Managing vegetation issues was one of the primary goals for 2024. One of the key variables for improving vegetation control was implementing a dynamic chemical approach rather than a one size fits all. This year our herbicide selection was strategically planned out based on location, water quality, species of plant, and desired duration of control. Which is why we operated with multiple different spray tanks and were constantly alternating between different chemical combinations in each. We also understand that health and safety is a big deal for us, and everyone else who shares this lake. As a result, we opted away from using herbicides in the swim area and volleyball area, and instead used mechanical removal when needed. In non high traffic swim areas we targeted vegetation that blocked boat house entries, boat navigation lanes, and hindered bank recreation. We also made a point to preserve natural areas of vegetation to provide balance for both the recreational activist and the die hard fisherman. The balance may never be perfect but we will always work to serve both the best we can. Which is why we encourage all property owners to come out and meet us when you see us on the lake, and let us know what your goals for your personal area are, so that we may provide the best service possible.

We also transitioned away from copper based herbicides and algaecides that can accumulate in the sediments and kill off the beneficial bacteria that break down and recycle nutrients. This will allow healthy bacteria colonies to begin to properly break down old dying plant material and promote a healthier ecosystem.

These chemical management strategies combined with biological control via grass carp and mechanical harvesting in areas of severe weed infestation, resulted in some amazing outcomes for this year.

Hydrilla, an invasive and very problematic species, has not been seen by us on the Lake since March of this year. Instead, many native species such as coontail, which is more beneficial for fish and wildlife, have taken its place. Overall vegetative coverage has decreased from 2023 and is in a more ideal range of 8-12% total surface area

coverage. We plan to continue to optimize our management going forward and making improvements each year. Our goal for vegetation management is to free up swimming and recreation, while also promoting fishing and areas of natural beauty. We will continue working towards this goal in 2025.

#### **End of Year Fish Data**

Our end of year fish survey for 2024 showed some significant improvements from 2023. Over the last year we have encouraged the harvest of bass and crappie due to overpopulation issues causing fish to be underweight and slow growing. In just one year of making changes the following outcomes have occurred:

- Bass relative weights (a measure of overall health) have increased from 87% in 2023 to 92% in 2024. This is a significant increase and far greater than we expected for just a single year.
- 2. Crappie relative weights also increased from 88% in 2023 to 89% in 2024. This is a normal rate of progression, especially for crappie due to how many offspring they can produce. Any increase in this short of time is amazing to see. Fisherman also report significant size increases on their average fishing day.
- Forage fish populations for gizzard shad, threadfin shad, and bluegill are similar to 2024 but more large bluegill were collected this year than in 2023.
- Redear and redbreast sunfish numbers both increased from 2023 to 2024. This is due to less predation pressure. These fish are subject to rapid population decline when too many bass are present because they only spawn one time.

Some of these numbers may seem like small scale improvements but when you consider the size of Lake Cherokee and the amount of fish present in the lake, these are very impressive results for only one year. We encourage everyone to continue to keep crappie and small or skinny bass. Harvest every year will be the key to continued improvement in the health of the fishery and maintaining that health in the future. We plan to continue the current management strategies for the fishery since results so far have exceeded expectations. We will also be working to produce additional forage fish in the hatchery ponds and work towards a plan for improving the health of the entire lake even more with water quality enhancements.

Our goal is to create the greatest private lake in the country and meet the needs of each and every stakeholder that calls Lake Cherokee home. This first year has been exciting and we look forward to 2025. Please reach out to us with any questions or comments that you may have about management for next year.



April 8, 2025 To be Determined May 13, 2025 Patty Stewart will present although her topic has yet to be formalized.



### Lucky New Year's Black-Eyed Pea Stew Prep 15 m Cook 2 h 45 m

Ready in 3 h

#### Ingredients

- 3 tablespoons vegetable oil
- 1 onion, chopped
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 3 cups finely shredded Napa cabbage
- 1 (8 ounce) can sliced water chestnuts, drained
- 1 pound ham hocks
- 1/8 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 2 bay leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon Cajun seasoning
- salt to taste
- 1 quart chicken stock 1 (10 ounce) package frozen black-eyed peas
- 1 1/2 cups basmati rice, well rinsed
- 3 cups water

#### **Directions**

Heat the oil in a deep pan or stockpot over medium-high heat. Stir in the onions and garlic, and cook until transparent, about 5 minutes. Mix in the Napa cabbage, toss and cook until wilted, about 2 minutes. Add the ham hocks, cayenne pepper, bay leaf, Cajun seasoning, and salt, stirring for 2 minutes more. Pour in the chicken stock and black-eyed peas. Bring the mixture to a boil, then reduce heat to low and cook uncovered for 2 hours. Meanwhile, place the rice and water into a saucepan. Bring to a boil, reduce the heat to low, cover, and simmer until all liquid is absorbed and rice is light and fluffy, about 20 minutes.

Before serving, remove the ham hocks from the pot. Coarsely chop the meat, and return to the black-eved pea mixture Serve hot over Basmati rice



#### Lake Cherokee Veterans **Memorial Update** January 2025

2024 was an amazing year for the Lake Cherokee Veterans Memorial. At the beginning of the year, we had about \$7000 in the bank, a beautiful design,

but an empty lot. In one year, we made lots of friends. raised \$123,000, celebrated Veterans Day at the site, held a sold-out Gala, raised 9 flags, and built a wall! Better yet, we can now show (not just talk about) our gratitude to those men and women who in their small parts, protected and strengthened our nation.

And there's more to come. Thanks to "The Flag Guy" (Greg Murphy) we will have 10 additional 10' flags

added to the site for 6 holidays. He volunteers for the Danville Masonic Lodge which uses proceeds for graduating seniors at Sabine and Kilgore High Schools. Give him a holler and thank him for his generosity. The Wall of Honor will hold 128 names of veterans who are important to our residents. How special for a child to see the name of their granddad or great granddad (!) engraved on the wall. The site will be accessible by land and by water and will become a park where visitors can reflect on Duty, Honor, and Country. The site will also be a place of celebration – not quite like a boisterous boat house party – but a celebration of life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness.

Add your veteran to the Wall of Honor. The Wall of Honor is a 4' high concrete wall in front



of the Flagpole display facing the lake. The face of the wall will be covered in sheer black granite. The center panel will display the large, engraved words "Duty Honor Country." The side panels will hold 128 names of veterans important to Lake

Cherokee members. As of December 11th, 100 names have been reserved. If you want to reserve a spot for you or your veteran, email me soon.

If you have already reserved a spot on the Wall of Honor, you should have received email #1 from me around Christmastime asking to verify your veteran's information. If you have not gotten this email, contact Katheryn Johnston immediately kacourville@ gmail.com. We will send all verified names to the engraver who will create a stencil for the wall. Mail #2 will be sent to you asking you to proof your veteran's stenciled name. It is important that all names are correct before we begin sandblasting!
